Susan J. Rehm, MD, an infectious diseases specialist, is medical director for the National Foundation for Infectious Diseases. Since 1983, Dr. Rehm has been a staff physician at the Cleveland Clinic in Cleveland, Ohio, and serves as vice chair of the Clinic's Department of Infectious Disease.

Dr. Rehm is a member of several professional societies, including the American College of Physicians, the American Medical Association and the American College of Physician Executives. Since 2002, she has been honored as one of the "Best Doctors in America."

Dr. Rehm holds faculty appointments at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine of Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio and Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. She is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians and was elected to Fellowship in the Infectious Diseases Society of America. In addition, Dr. Rehm has co-authored numerous publications and studies contributing to the field of infectious disease research.
